Reading Language Arts

- In reading, students will work on identifying major events using key details, identifying characters and setting using key details, and identifying the central message.
- The May phonics focus skills are segmenting and decoding words with long vowels spelled with vowel teams, applying various long vowel spellings, and applying suffixes.
- New Heart Words: walk, before,again,who, been
- The writing focus is on writing an opinion piece.

Social Studies

- Students will identify how items you choose have value (opportunity cost) and the items that you do not choose also have value.
- Students will describe the skills people need for their work, home, and community and describe how tools and products have affected the way people live, work or play.

Math

- Students will understand that ten ones make a new unit called a "ten."
- Students will represent two-digit numbers in multiple ways.
- Students will compare two-digit numbers based on the meaning of the tens and ones digits using words and symbols.
- Students will sort items into categories and determine the categories of items that are already sorted.
- Students will represent data to make it easier to count and compare.

Science

- Students will predict how the amount of sunlight will change during the year.
- Students will find patterns in the amount of sunlight during different times of the day and year.
