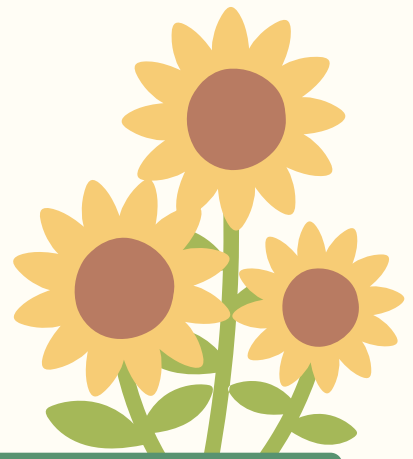

What We're Learning

Reading/ELA

Students will continue developing their opinion writing skills by composing opinion essays while reinforcing essential writing techniques. This includes effectively using linking words to connect opinions with supporting reasons and crafting strong introductions to establish a clear stance in their essays.

Math

This month, students will identify all the factors of a number between 1 and 100, as well as the common multiples of given numbers. We will also explain how the factors of a number relate to the dimensions of its rectangular arrays. Lastly, students will classify numbers as prime or composite and justify their thinking with diagrams, words and numbers.

Social Studies/Science

In Science, as we move into unit 3, students will explore the various ways the earth's surface has changed and continues to change and the role water, wind and heat play in these changes.

In Social Studies, we will explore the founding of the 13 original colonies and how they differed by region. In honor of Women's History Month we will explore the contributions of women scientist and activist throughout history.
