Learning Focus

Social Studies

- Students will understand that people make choices about needs and wants.
- Understand that people do many kinds of work or provide services. We are also learning that people use money to buy and sell.

Science

• Students will explore weather patterns and learn about what weather changes they can observe in everyday life



Math

• Students use different models to help them understand subtraction stories.

Health

 Students will be able to describe being healthy and how germs make us sick. They will also learn about health helpers who keep us well or care for us when we are sick.

Reading/Language Arts

Ask and answer questions about a text

- Identify important and unimportant information in a text
- Use capitalization and punctuation to write a sentence.
- Sound out 2-4 phonemes (sounds) in words
- New Heart words: say, have, now, said, come, down
